

## Supported Accommodation

Mr White was being released after serving a six-year sentence for lewd and libidinous behaviour. Mr White was unable to return to his usual area of residence as his victims were still residing in that particular area. Additional checks undertaken by the police and the criminal justice social work department also stated it was not a suitable area. Mr White was referred to Sacro for a satellite tenancy. Upon his release Mr White was initially placed in temporary homeless accommodation provided by housing services. An additional requirement of Mr Whites' licence was to be electronically monitored. Sacro staff supported Mr White into his new accommodation and remained with him until the tag had been fitted. A satellite tenancy was identified after four-months in the temporary accommodation. A furniture package was requested and a community care grant application made. At a social work review it was agreed to extend the satellite tenancy for another six-months. During this time Mr White continued to be of good behaviour and did not re-offend. Mr White's tenancy was transferred to a Scottish Secure Tenancy after one-year. Sacro continued support and monitoring for an additional few months before withdrawing support by mutual consent and with the agreement of the social work department.
