Both services offer mediation free at the point of delivery to all residents, irrespective of housing tenure.

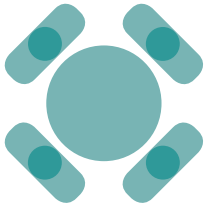

Competition Rules

1. Members of the public are invited to nominate a person whom they believe to be an exceptionally good neighbour. Any resident (aged 18 or over) of the City of Dundee or the council area of Angus can be nominated for the competitions.
2. The person nominating should complete the nomination form (available on the Sacro website) or post, fax or e-mail a letter stating in no more than 70 words why a person should win the good neighbour award. They should supply the name and address of the good neighbour and also their own name and contact details.

The closing date is Friday 20 November 2009.

4. There will be two winners – one for Angus and one for Dundee, each with the prize of a Christmas hamper. No cash equivalents are available.
5. Following shortlisting by Community Mediation staff, the winners will be chosen by the two service advisory groups. These groups comprise representatives of the Police, Housing Agencies, Community Learning and Development, Anti-Social Behaviour / Community Safety Teams, Federation of Tenants Associations, a Volunteer Centre and Sacro (Safeguarding Communities, Reducing Conflict).
6. The judges' decisions are final, and are not open for challenge or negotiation.
7. A person may not nominate a close blood or step relative (parent, son, daughter, brother, sister, grandparent, grandchild, aunt, uncle) or spouse/partner for this award.
8. The winners and the persons making the nomination agree to have their names mentioned in publicity, and to be photographed at the time of the award.
9. None of the judges, or employees of Dundee or Angus Community Mediation Services, are eligible to participate in this competition.
